## What is ISO 9001?

This ISO quality management standard defines how something is done. It is built on seven principles: customer focus, engagement of senior management, engagement of people, a processoriented approach, continuous improvement, evidence-based decision making and relationship management.

# Why is ISO 9001 Important?

# What is ISO 14001?

ISO 14001 provides a set of standards, or best practices, for companies that want to minimize their environmental footprint, comply with relevant legal requirements, and achieve their environmental objectives.

Environmental management requires organizations to continually consider environmental matters relevant to their organizations. Examples include reducing carbon emissions, waste management, optimizing how resources are used, and supply chain considerations. The five elements of ISO 14001 are: an environmental policy, planning, implementation and operation, checking and corrective action, and management review.

# Why is ISO 14001 important?

Companies that achieve ISO 14001 have strategically committed to improving their environmental footprint and have the support of senior management to proactively improve performance over time. In a competitive industry like salvage, we expect holding this certification will differentiate us from players who don't put the environment first when it comes to salvage and wreck removal.

# What is ISO 45001?
